STEPS OF HOPE...

Linda was admitted to Challenge Farm for care and protection in September 2014, along with her siblings. Their mom passed away earlier that year, leaving the children alone to fend for themselves. Their father, an alcoholic, was absent. So, Linda's older sister started brewing alcohol to get money to feed them, but the situation posed a risk to the children's safety. The area chief intervened and reported the case to the local Children's Department.

Linda worked hard in school and eventually joined university in 2023, pursuing a bachelor's in criminology. Over the summer, she completed a 3-month internship at the Kitale Main Prison and started her final year in September. Linda is set to complete all her classes in April 2027. **She's scored all A's and B's so far!** She hopes to become a probation officer. We're so proud of you, Linda!



CHILD SAFTY TRAINING...

Our staff is always learning to be better equipped to help vulnerable children...

Our 6 welding trainees are currently interning at local welding shops through October 2026. They've been involved in welding and fabrication work, repairs, making doors, windows, chairs, gates, and other metal projects both in the shops and off-site. The young men are also learning about customer relations and communication, marketing, and business management. They're seeing first-hand how welding skills can provide a livelihood.
